2025 Erwin-Ramsey

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

brwarchitects hosts the Erwin-Ramsey Fellowship for graduate and fourth-year undergraduate Architectural students each summer. Students from the University of Virginia, Virginia Tech, James Madison University, and Hampton University may apply. One Fellowship is awarded each year.

The Erwin-Ramsey Fellowship aims to deepen architectural contributions to the city of Charlottesville, where the firm has worked for the past 40 years. During this intensive three- or four-week program, the Fellow will design a research project focused on addressing a community need for residents of Charlottesville. brwarchitects will provide the Fellow with resources and mentorship, as well as a network of professional and community relationships.

The Fellow should develop a project or focus which culminates in a presentation, workshop, or other public event, as well as a final deliverable. Past projects have included:

- A workshop using human-centered design principles to proactively design accessible spaces.
- An exploration of community agriculture solutions to food scarcity for public housing residents.
- Design strategies to engage underserved youth and teen populations in Charlottesville.
- An affordable housing development curriculum for faith-based congregations.
- Interventions in civic spaces, investigating the social ownership of public spaces.
- A community resource for holding the City accountable to its affordable housing promises.

Program Description

This summer, each apprentice will receive temporary employment status and will be paid hourly at a competitive rate with the expectation of a 40 hour work week. 
Summer Internship Opportunity - MBB Architects
