HamptonU Experience Registration Process

The HamptonU Experience is a cloud-based, personalized dashboard that provides students, faculty, and staff with a centralized and customizable interface to access various campus resources, services, and applications. One such application is the Registration Dashboard, the portal that students use for course registration.

This registration guide will demonstrate each step of the course registration process. It includes photo representation for each step, and tips that will assist you throughout the registration process.

First Year Experience

The Department of Freshman Studies/First Year Experience is dedicated to providing a comprehensive core of support services that will influence academic achievement and retention.

In achieving its mission and adhering to the University's mission, the Department of Freshman Studies/First Year Experience assist freshman student's with transitioning from high school to college by providing assistance with advising, registration, academic support and social and adjustment counseling. In addition, we focus on the following areas; freshman merit scholars, freshman on academic probation and freshman on reduced workload. These areas are monitored with bi-weekly advisement and by monthly seminars.

New Student Orientation

Entering freshmen and transfer students are required to participate in an intensive orientation program one week before the beginning of classes. The primary goal of the orientation program is to assist new students in the transition from high school or from another institution of higher learning to Hampton University. Through a program of structured activities, students learn about the University and the University becomes more aware of and responsive to the needs of its new students. Step 3: Click on your major and view the courses required for your first year of study. Register for the courses that are listed for the first semester.

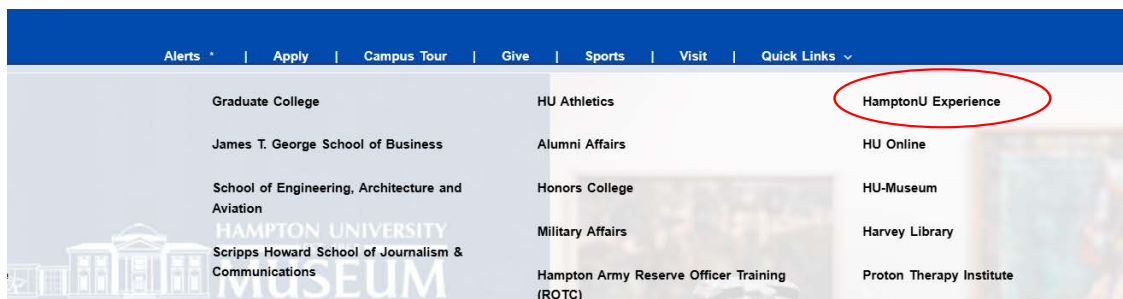
HOW TO ACCESS HamptonU Experience

Step 1: Go to the Hampton University Homepage using the following link www.hamptonu.edu.

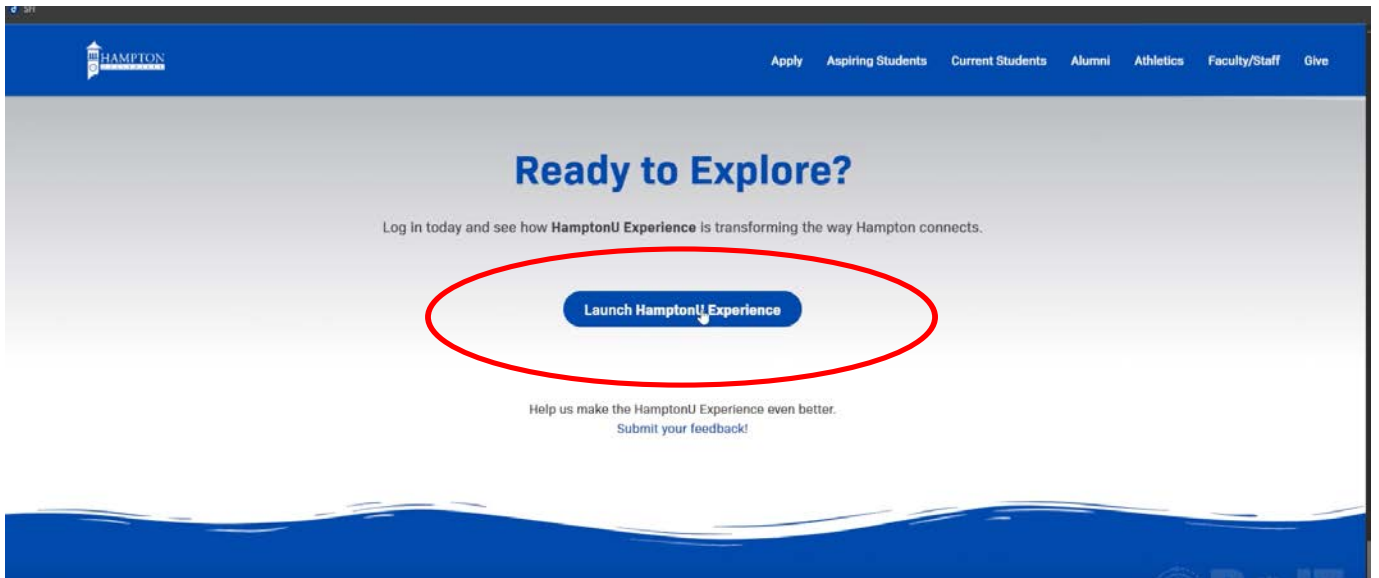
Step 2: Click on Quick links (to the top right of the page).



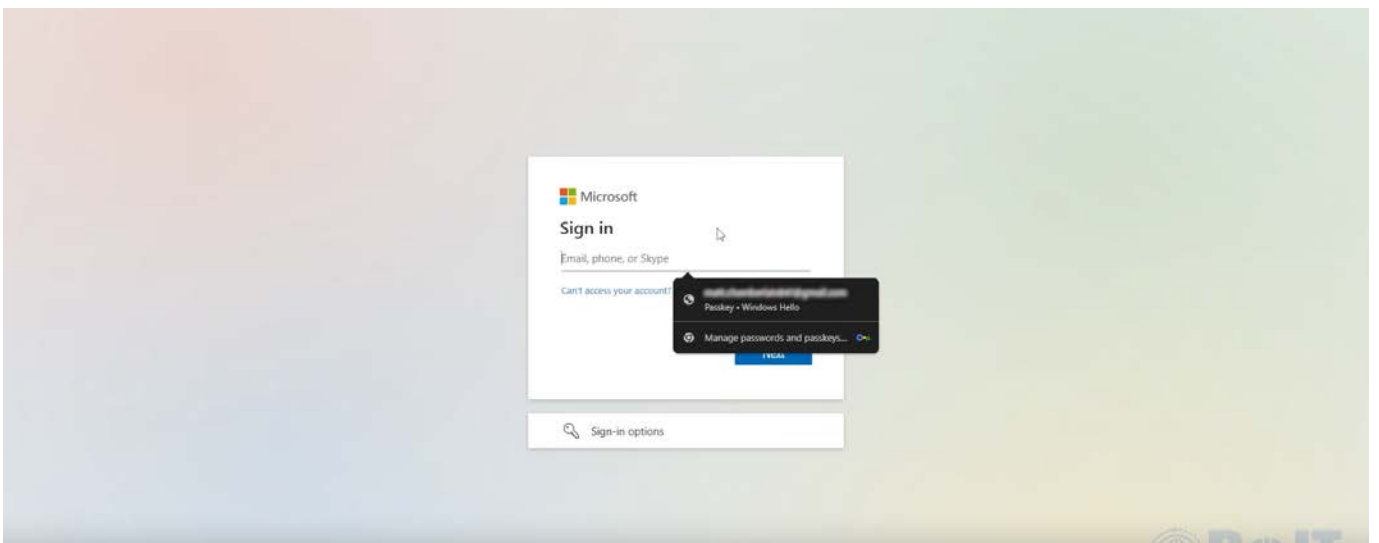
Step 3: Click on HamptonU Experience

Step 5: Enter your Hampton University Email address and Infotech Password.

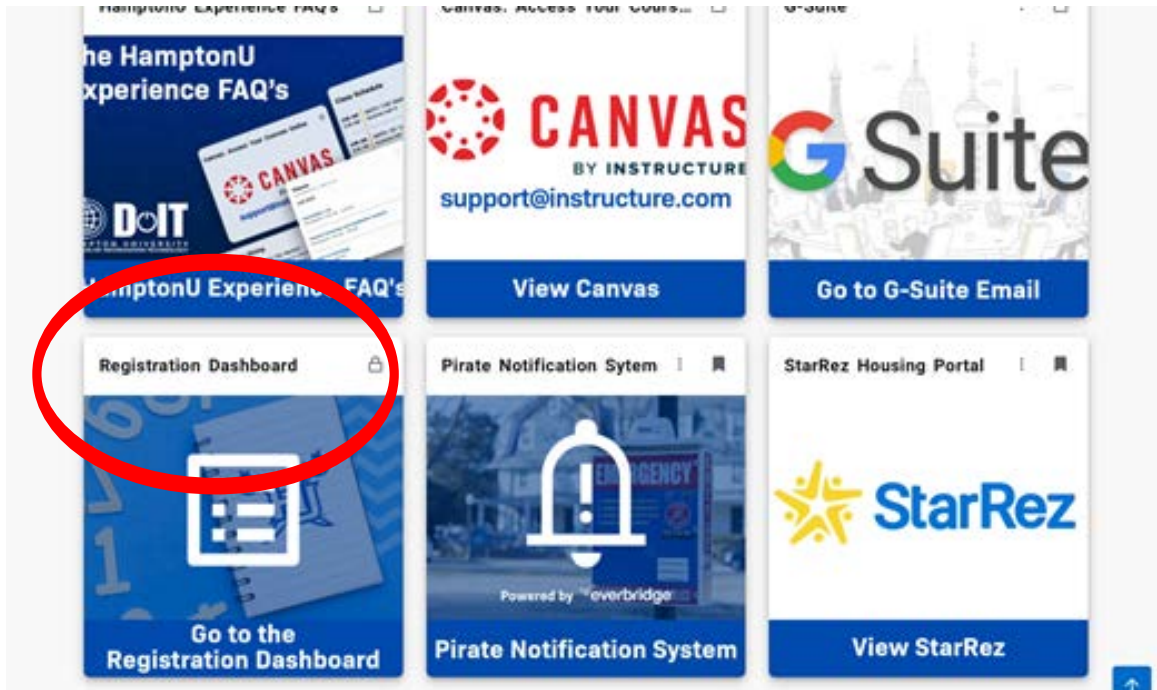

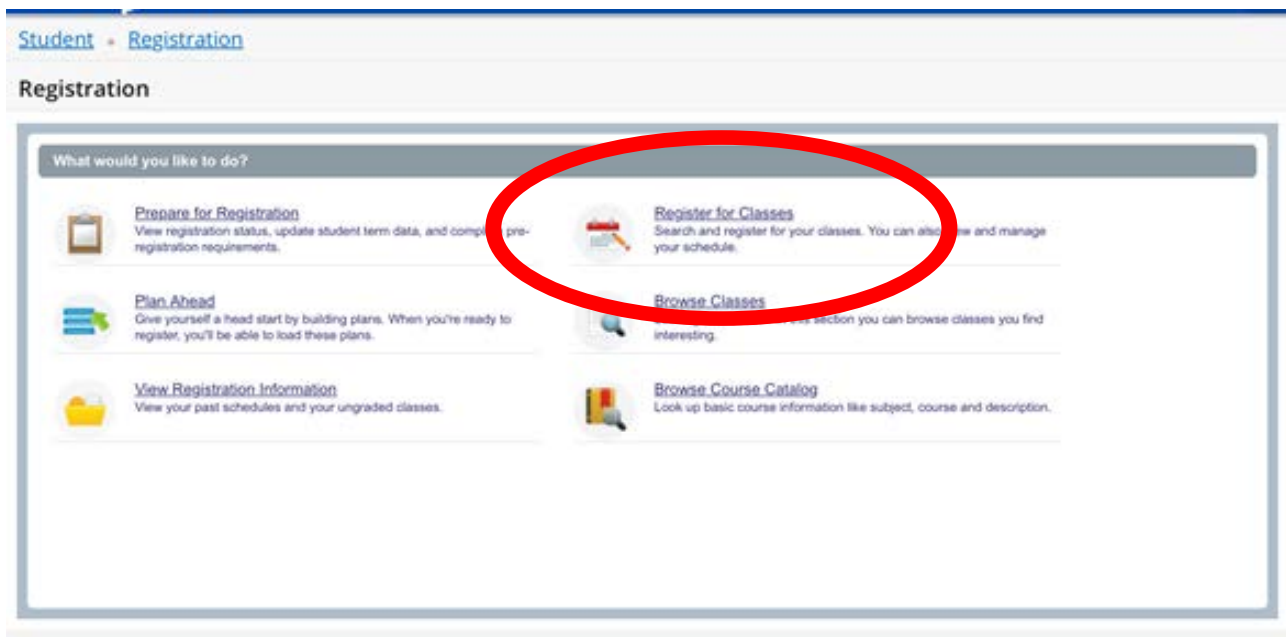
Now let's pick your classes!

To register for courses, follow the steps listed below.

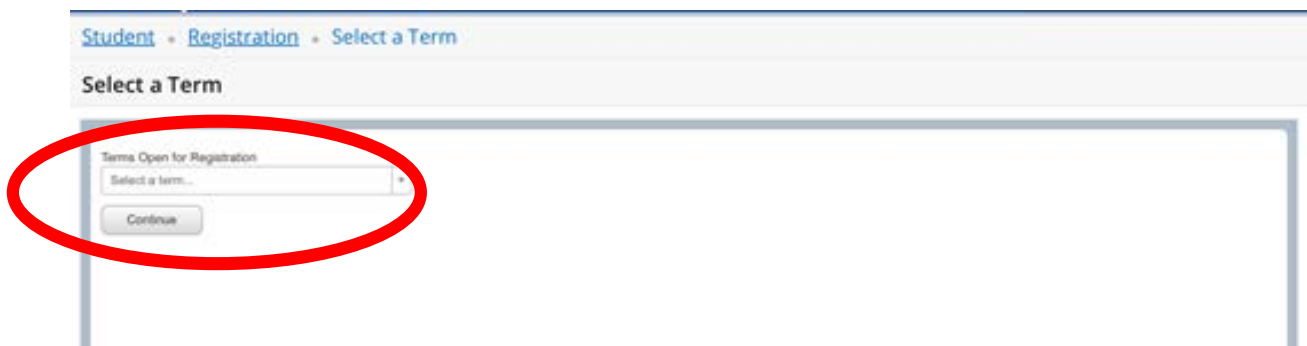
Step 1: Click on the Registration Dashboard card to open the registration portal.



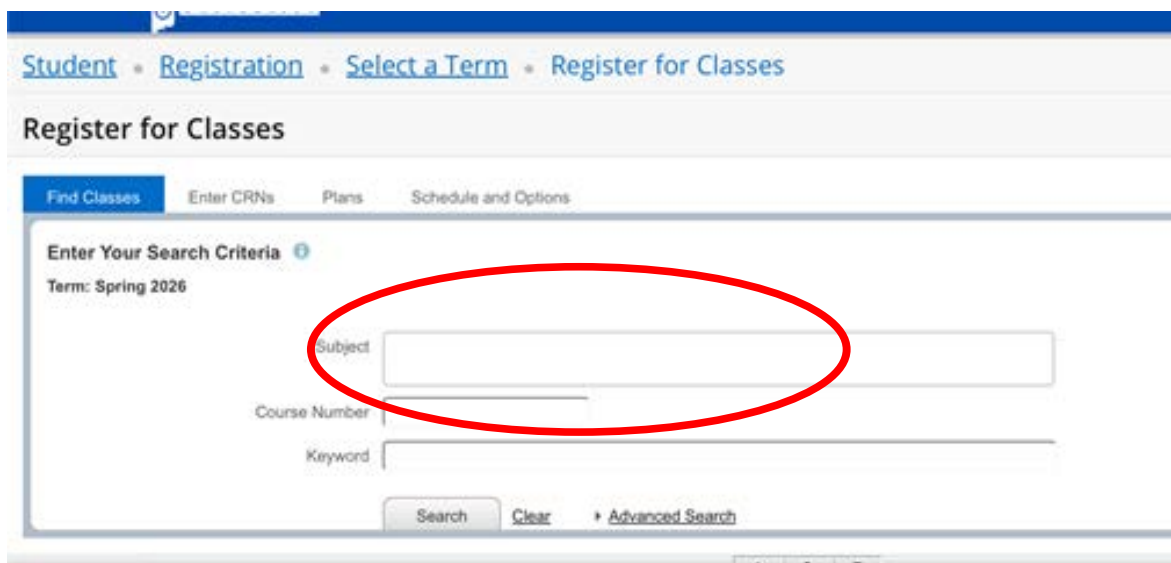
Step 2: Click on Register for Classes.

Step 6: Look at all of the dates and times offered for your desired course. Once you have selected a date and time that works best on your schedule, click on the course and hit submit.

Special Note: When looking at the dates and times for your desired course, you will see that we do not offer classes every single day. The majority of our courses are offered on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday (MWF) or Tuesday and Thursday (TR). In a few cases you may only have class one day a week. This date will be indicated by one letter (Example: “W” for Wednesday, “R” for Thursday, etc.).

You are now registered for a course!

Final Step: Do it all again! Complete Steps 4-6 until you have registered for all of the first semester courses listed on your major curricula guide.

As you build your schedule, your registered courses will appear on your registration window.
